

The new Application for Tree Removal/ Replanting is required for any tree and shrub removal on your property. On the reverse side of the form is a list of trees approved for planting by Brick Township, who is closely monitoring the removal of trees due to removals being performed without the Township approval. The trees aid in the water mitigation and were part of the original design of the Lions Head South community. Please abide by the new process as fines within the community as well as Brick Township will be assessed without the proper approvals.

With the warmer weather approaching, our TurfMasters Lawn Service will commence. Please be reminded if you have any complaints or concerns, call TurfMasters directly at: 732-349-0444.

In addition, beginning late April, Federal Irrigation will be returning to activate the sprinkler systems in our community. If you have any complaints or issues, retrieve a Federal Irrigation form from outside the Clubhouse and place in the Complaint Box. All problems will be investigated within 24-48 hours. GARDEN CLUB

"When you plant a garden, you plant happiness." Farmer's Almanac

Our first meeting of 2022 was held on March 9th. Because of the Pride deadline, I am unable to report on that meeting. We'll catch up next month.

After a roller coaster of temperatures in January and February, we can only hope March lives up to her reputation of "in like a lion and out like a lamb". And so, finally, April and Spring have arrived. If we were lucky with some nice days in March, you had a chance to get a start outdoors such as removing diseased, or dead branches, deadheading tulips and daffodils, (leave foliage to die naturally) and dividing and transplanting of perennials such as chrysanthemums and daylilies. Forsythia should be trimmed after blooming.

Testing your soil Ph can be very helpful to a successful garden. For a nominal fee, the Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Ocean County will test it for you. Call 732-349-1246 for information. You can also purchase a testing kit at your local garden center.

I know I said I wouldn't mention the recipe for a homemade weed killer again, but for all newcomers or for those of you who may have missed or lost it; here it is. It's easy to make, cheap and it works.

DIRECTIONS:

Heat up 1 quart of white vinegar (any kind) Add 2 cups Epsom salt (stir till all dissolved) Add ¼ cup dish soap (any kind)

When cool, transfer to a spray bottle and go to work. Great for weeds in cement cracks or between blocks. Larger weeds may need a second application.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT:

The only way to ensure rain is to give the garden a good soaking. Weeds seem to grow at precisely the rate you pull them out. Nothing ever looks like the picture on the seed packet. Autumn follows summer, winter follows autumn, drought follows new plantings. However bare the lawn, grass always seems to grow in between the patio pavingstones. When weeding, the best way to make sure you are removing a weed and not a valuable plant is to pull on it. If it comes out of the ground easily, it is a valuable plant.

Our Garden Club has a long history. Beginning in 1987; it had a modest beginning with just a few volunteers who wanted to enhance our community with plantings and flowers for all to enjoy. Today we are 22 members strong and supported by our Building and Grounds Committee. We tend 5 gardens, do seasonal decorations at both front and rear entrances and plant various containers around the pool and elsewhere. We also note areas that are in need of attention.

The Security Committee together with Buildings and Grounds are in the process of getting proposals for the installation and monitoring of additional cameras for our community. As soon as bids are received and evaluated, residents will be notified of the company awarded the contract, the coverage it provides and the cost to the association.

For potholes, please call Lin (732-920-9099) in the office and she will add the location to the list and forward to Brick Public Works Department for repair.

Each month we will have information regarding security and safety for our community. This month the focus is on "imposters" that pose as government officials. (reprinted from NCA - National Committee on Aging).

• Financial scams targeting the elderly can be devastating, leaving older adults in a vulnerable position and without time to recoup their losses.

• Older adults lose an estimated \$3 billion each year to financial scams.

• Government imposters call unsuspecting victims and pretend to be from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Social Security Administration, or Medicare. They may say you have unpaid taxes and threaten arrest or deportation if you don't pay up immediately. Or they may say your Social Security or Medicare benefits are in danger of being cut off if you don't provide personal identifying information (that can then be used to commit fraud). Government impersonators often "spoof" the actual phone numbers of the government agency or call from the same zip code (202 for Washington, DC).

• Don't be afraid or embarrassed to talk about it with someone you trust. You are not alone, and there are people who can help. Doing nothing could only make it worse. Keep handy the phone numbers and resources you can turn to, including the local police, your bank (if money has been taken from your accounts), and Adult Protective Services. To obtain the contact information for <u>Adult Protective Services</u> in your area, call the Eldercare Locator, a government sponsored national resource line, at: 1-800-677-1116, or visit their website at: <u>https://eldercare.acl.gov</u>.

Miscellaneous security/safety GENTLE REMINDERS that apply to residents and visitors alike:

*Dog waste MUST be picked up and disposed of properly (Town ordinance)

*Cigarette butts are considered litter and need to be disposed of properly (Town ordinance)

*Vehicles CANNOT block sidewalks (Town ordinance)

*Vehicles need to be parked faced in the direction of traffic (Town ordinance)

THROUGH THE YEARS LHS 40TH ANNIVERSARY

Lions Head South 40th Anniversary Celebration June 11, 2022

In preparation for our "anniversary," owners that have been here since the beginning (the first homeowners Ann and Jim Clark moved into 20 Tennis Court in November of 1982, however the final homes weren't completed until 1987) and are still residents, have been contacted to give insight to how LHS has evolved "Through the Years" the theme for our celebration.

Lion Head South "Originals"

Dot and Frank Berardinelli moved into 4 Garland Drive on 12/2/1986, from Millington in Morris County. Like many others, they were retiring and wanted to downsize. They had a second home in Seaside Park and were familiar with the area - their sons were lifeguards - when friends, Mitch and Gloria Venezia moved into 87 Lauren Lane. They came to visit them and went to the sales office. A lot on Garland had opened up and with \$50 down, they had two weeks to make a final decision. They chose the Hawthorne and were very happy with their purchase.

Dot recalls "you couldn't touch a leaf or a branch" in the yard because of the rules and regulations and "no one complained about it." "Everyone was more than happy to help other people" and "that being a part of a community is to work together" she added. As a member of the Garden Club "we used to dig out extra trees on people's yards and replant near the bocce court or wherever" so a landscaper wouldn't have to be hired.

"I never laughed so hard," Dot recalls, as at the "Mock" wedding Spring fundraiser - the "best event in all my 86 years" - so much so that her stomach hurt at the end of the evening. Dot was also president of WGA in '98 and '99 and the only woman President of the LHCC from 2000-2003 when the Association took over the club (they used to have 400 members that included LHS and LHN). Besides that, she was Chairperson of Community Awareness and worked with three mayors. Her reflection of the past years: "I've loved every minute that I've lived here and I just want people to know this is a great place and what you put into it - is what you will get out of it - you have to make an effort, too!"

* * *

Ruth and Jake Strauss moved into LHS on March 26, 1986, from Nutley, New Jersey. Jake had just retired and they wanted a smaller home and less up-keep. After looking at several retirement communities in Monmouth

and Ocean Counties, they chose Lions Head South for a number of reasons. They wanted to be able to travel easily to their family members in North Jersey and Pennsauken areas. The nearby Parkway and Route 70 made this possible. The quality of home construction and variety of models, golf course, and amenities were appealing as well. It was an adventure unfolding, with new streets being paved and sections of homes being built and sold one new area at a time.

"There was a feeling of camaraderie among the residents who stepped up to volunteer to organize and develop an active lifestyle. We all were starting a new chapter in our lives and hoped we had made the right choice to move into an Adult Community," Ruth said. The Committees were forming and there were many parties and activities to enjoy, as well as philanthropic fund raising events for residents needs and for the Brick Community. When the Lionettes were unable to find a sponsor for a Fashion Show for their fundraiser, which each year had provided a scholarship for graduating students at both high schools in Brick, they decided to perform an all-male mock wedding. The wedding of Susan Mock and William Wedding was held in April of 1992, for 350 people at Mike Doolans in Spring Lake Heights (Jake agreed to be "Bride" and Ed Merlino the "Groom") with complete Bridal Party, parents, dignitaries, etc. It is still fondly spoken of today.

"We jumped in with both feet," said Ruth. Husband Jake was appointed as a Trustee representative (Lions Head Corporation still had Board Control) due to the resignation of a resident for health reasons, and then he ran for office and served two more terms. Additionally, he was inspired to organize and institute the Holiday Party at Christmas for income challenged school children in Brick Sadly, he passed away on December 11, 1998, the night before the first party. However, the party was held and the parties continued for ten more years with support and love from so many Lions Head volunteers.

"It was a wonderful decision moving here. The residents are more than neighbors, they are like family; helpful and generous with their time and concerns," Ruth stated. "Because we are a pocket community, with no through streets, we have peaceful, green nature blessed surroundings, yet just short distances to areas that address our needs," Ruth said with a smile on her face. Her hope is that all the new residents will soon be able to enjoy all the activities LHS has provided her for so many years.

5. Place half the sandwich in heated press or griddle. (If using griddle place a peace of parchment paper over sandwich half & a heavy pan on top of parchment. Press down).

6. Flip the sandwich & continue to cook until cheese melts.






