

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
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EDITORIAL





While you're inside keeping toasty warm, remember these few winter suggestions.

- Set indoor plants on trays with moistened pebbles to maintain humidity.
- Check also for pests. Spray with insecticidal soap if needed.
- Use salt on ice sparingly where plants may be. Try using sand instead.
- Brush heavy snow from evergreens to prevent broken branches.
- Use caution when walking. Watch for hard to see ice patches.
- Use these confining days to think about changes to your gardens.
- Enjoy browsing those seed catalogues for new and exciting plants.
- Remember to feed the birds. Their natural foods are mostly gone by now.

Quick, Healthy & Easy - to start the NEW YEAR! <u>BROILED GROUPER PARMESAN</u> - GROUPER CAN BE PURCHASED AT SHORE FRESH SEAFOOD MARKET & RESTAURANT, Bay & Bridge Ave. Point Pleasant, N.J.

- 2 lbs. fresh grouper fillets
- 2 tbsp lemon juice
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup butter, softened
- 3 tbsp mayonnaise
- 1 dash hot sauce (Tabasco)
- Salt & Pepper
- 1. Place the grouper fillets on a greased baking sheet & brush with lemon juice.
- 2. In a small bowl, stir cheese butter, mayonnaise, hot sauce, salt & pepper.
- 3. Broil fillets 4 6 mins so they can be flaked with a fork. Remove from the oven & spread the above mixture on top of the fillets.
- 4. Return to broiler for additional seconds or until topping is browned & hubbly.

<u>**CAULIFLOWER FRIED RICE**</u> - total time 20 mins recipe by Lisa Wood.

- 1 bag of frozen Trader Joe's riced cauliflower (thawed) or a fresh head chopped & riced in a food processor (thawed).
- 2 tbsp. sesame oil
- 1 small onion
- 1 cup frozen peas & carrots
- 1/4 cup broccoli (chopped)
- 3 tbsps. soy sauce salt & pepper
- 1 egg

Instructions:

- 1. Heat oil in a large skillet on medium/high heat.
- 2. Saute onions until tender. Add peas, carrots, & broccoli & cook until soft.
- 3. Add frozen cauliflower (or fresh riccd cauliflower) to the pan.
- 4. Add approximately 2 tbsps. of soy sauce & mix well.
- 5. Slide the rice onto one side of the pan & scramble the egg on the other side of the pan.
- 6. Once the egg is cooked. mix in with the rice and add additional soy sauce to taste preference.
- 7. Add pepper & garlic salt to taste
- 8. Serve immediately

QUICK & EASY DESSERT - suggestion recipe by

- 1. Mash 4 ripe bananas with fork
- 2. Add 1 tbsp lemon juice & 2 tbsps. honey
- 3. Mix with 32oz low fat (or fat free) yogurt
- 4. Prepare 2 cups fresh berries set aside a small amount for garnish

5. 1/2 cup of pecans chopped - set aside a small amount for garnish
















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When you joined our community you signed an agreement to abide by the Bylaws of the Lions Head South Association. As a new member of our community, you should have received a copy of these Bylaws which include the Rules and Regulations that govern us all. If you did not receive a copy, one can be obtained from the Administrator's office in the clubhouse. There are certain things contained in the Architectural Section of these Bylaws that pertain to the exterior of your new home. Please read these carefully. Below are outlined just a few of these Bylaws which should be of interest to you. Specific details are covered in said Bylaws:

Exterior Modification:

Any changes to the home such as Windows, Doors, Siding, Roofs, Soffets, Patios, etc. **REQUIRE AN APPLICATION WHICH MUST BE APPROVED BY THE ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE**. Applications are available from the Association Office in the Clubhouse.

Trees & Tree Trimming:

All homes are required to have at least one deciduous tree on the street side of the dwelling. Minimum height is 5 feet. Bylaws contain a list of approved tree types. Planting of these trees is **HOMEOWNER RESPONSIBILITY**. The trimming/pruning of trees and shrubs adjacent to your home is also your responsibility. This includes trees in back of the home separating you from your neighbor - this is not common ground, but is considered "green area". All trees/shrubs in the green area are your responsibility. Once again, see the Bylaws for details.

Garbage/Recycle Cans:

The Bylaws provide specific guidelines as to when these items can be put out for collection; and when they must be removed. PLEASE NOTE: All Garbage/Recycle containers must be stored inside the garage when not out for collection.

Air Conditioners:

All the homes in our community have central air conditioning systems. WINDOW OR THRU-THE-WALL AIR CONDITIONERS ARE NOT PERMITTED.

The purpose of the Architectural Committee is to maintain the appearance of our community. None of the Bylaw requirements are overly restrictive, and many homeowners have completed extensive remodeling projects within the guidelines provided by these Bylaws.

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# **2021 LHSA APPROVED BUDGET - EXPLAINED**

#### THE GOOD NEWS IS - THERE WILL BE NO INCREASE IN THE HOA FEE FOR 2021! It will remain at \$125 per month.

In the December 2020 Pride (last month) the Trustees inserted a 2-page printout of the approved two page 2021 Budget. This was done to comply with the responsibility to inform the community on a timely basis. The Finance Committee feels that additional explanation is appropriate, and due to time restraints for inserting information into the Pride, was unable to do so in time for the December issue. Hence this article and the following 2 pages. The two 2021 Budget pages printed herein contain the same data as those printed in the December Pride, but we have added some footnotes to further explain certain budget line items.

When looking at the printouts if you add the 2020 Actual Amount as of 9/30 to the 2020 Balance as of 9/30 you will get a total which will indicate how close the 2020 Budget will come to its target for each line item. Remember, Budgets are an estimate of anticipated expenses. (For example- Item 501-Salaries shows a combined total of \$160,000 which was the 2020 Budget amount; however things such as raises have to be considered, therefore the 2021 amount was recommended to be \$165,000. That doesn't mean \$165,000 will be expended, but by budgeting the higher amount, we are covered for the year). Also, some line items, due to unforeseen circumstances, came out higher or lower than the 2020 Budget estimates. Reasons for this were looked into and adjustments were made for 2021.

As mentioned above, following are some footnotes which we hope will help you understand the rationale for certain line items on the 2021 Budget:

#### FOOTNOTES TO THE 2021 BUDGET

Refer to the following 2021 Budget Pages

- (1) Actual amount exceeded budget amount hence increase. (Most likely due to increase in investment gains).
- (2) Turfmaster- At the requests from many homeowners concerning the condition of the landscaping (lawns, etc.) in the community, the contract for 2021 was revised to provide additional care and treatments.
- (3) Snow Removal- Although there was no requirement for snow removal during the past winter season, amounts have to be provided to allow for contingencies. Only necessary expenses will be disbursed.
- (4) Painting and minor upkeep repair required. Funds provided for this last year were used nominally.
- (5) 546-A, E & F- Initially, tree work was included in item 546-A; now with special requirements mandated by the town, including permit and inspection fees, some of these funds are now allocated to new line items 546-E & F.
- (6) Throughout the community there are numerous stormwater basins and "creeks" that need to be kept clear. It has now been mandated by the EPA and the Township that this is our responsibility.
- (7) In 2019 the roving security service was discontinued as being ineffective. At the time the Trustees indicated that they would look at possible viable alternatives, thus funds have to be allocated for a possible future contingency.
- (8) 2020 9-month Actual and Budget Balance amounts are listed as a guideline.

## **PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL**

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2020-2021 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a **physician script/note** which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician. Please respond as soon as possible as the winter season will be here soon. Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.

The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

#### ALWAYS CALL 911 FOR ANY MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Please be sure to keep on hand extra supplies of medications and food, so there is no need to leave the house during, or immediately after a snowstorm. The weather predications generally provide ample warning time for making preparations.

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
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# Sudoku Answers





When shooting indoors everyone's first thought is to use a flash. While this is often a good move, shooting indoors without a flash can produce some very interesting images.

Using the natural light will enhance many images. Someone in the glow of a candle is a good example. Using a flash in this case will overpower the golden glow of the candle. This is also true of shooting an event on stage. A flash will eliminate the stage lights and create harsh shadows

Many of these shots will have a slow shutter speed, so you may need some additional camera support. If you don't have a tripod, try leaning against something, placing your elbows on a firm support, and using the self timer.
