

GARDEN CLUB

At this writing, the holiday season is full upon us. So far it has been a typical Fall with both warm and cool days. Hopefully, it is a harbinger for a mild winter. We can only hope. Our November meeting was a busy one. In addition to reviewing our officers for the coming year, it is time to consider all our garden assignments and various positions that keep our club alive and vibrant. We are again delighted that Clare Mathiasen will stay on as our chairperson.

After the meeting, we enjoyed our Holiday luncheon. Since our summer in-house luncheon was so successful, we decided to do it again, except this time it was "pot luck"-a great way to share recipes from all our great cooks. Our thanks to Lucy Coburn, Elaine Long and Jeannine Hogan for all the organizing of this fun event.

With the cooling weather and all the business of the holidays, it's hard to think about gardening. By now your outdoor gardens should be cleaned of debris and dead plants, sprinkled with Preen (to limit weed growth in the spring) and covered with mulch. So, what does a gardener do in the North when the weather turns cold? Well, if you're like me, you turn indoors. No matter the size of your living space, nothing brightens it up more than a variety of beautiful house plants. There are a large number of plants that are suited to indoors, some even help improve the air quality of your home. Following are some of the more popular ones that don't require much attention and are easy to find.

Succulents are probably for you if you don't have a green thumb. They live for a long time without much attention. Several varieties are available and some come already planted in clusters of different colors and textures. Just place them in a sunny window and watch them thrive.

Snake plants are a popular option for brightening up an indoor space. Much like succulents, they're easy to grow and don't require much space or maintenance.

Aloe Vera, technically a succulent, is one of the most popular house plants. In addition to visual appeal, they have medicinal properties. Just spread some of the plant's juice on a burn or scrape for immediate relief. However, when ingested, it is toxic to people and pets so be careful handling.

Jade plants are tough, easy to grow succulents that grow well in containers and appreciate the warm dry conditions often found in homes.

Croton plants, with their varied colors, add a tropical feeling to your home. They look good alone or blended with other arrangements. They like a sunny window.

Ferns, such as Boston or Asparagus are a lovely addition to your inside garden. They are a little more

difficult to keep as they require a moist area and may need spritzing of water daily depending on the humidity in your home.

Last, but not least, is the Philodendron, a beautiful vining plant that does well indoors. It requires little water, will grow for many years and may help remove toxins from the air.


These are just a few suggestions, so, with little thought and some light effort, you can bring the outdoors into your home for the winter months.

As we head into the final month of the year, we wrap up a very busy and successful season for the golf course operations. During 2021 the membership has trended upward and we will finish the year with 118 members. Income broke \$60K for the year. Every effort will be made to continue to increase membership and overall income. The LHCC has been and will continue to be a great asset for our village and members. The beauty of the course enhances the aesthetic value to the community.

The last General Meeting held on October 18th was at best a disappointment in that once again limited interest was shown by the membership as is reflected in the low turn-out. I appreciate those who took the time to show up for the meeting. As it turned out, we lacked a quorum to vote, less than 25% of membership attended, and we could not vote on a new member for the Board of Directors. Marcene Talty was temporarily appointed to the Board and will formally be voted in at the next General Membership Meeting. It is imperative that we generate increased interest in these meetings as the overall organization, operation, funding, scheduling, plans and direction are discussed and it is the one time that members have the opportunity to hear what direction the course is taking, ask questions and provide an input. Your input is important; you do have a say and a vote. We need your support to get the best results from the operation and the limited assets we have to operate. Be there, speak up, get involved, be a part of the golf course operations.

The last Scramble of the year was scheduled for November 9th. If weather and the numbers of players required signed up, minimum of 24 required, the scramble would have been played and the results posted to the LHS Website. The first Scramble of 2022 is scheduled for April 12, 2022.

The last Board of Directors meeting was held on October 12th; minutes are posted to the LHS Clubhouse, LHCC BB and LHS Website. The following are key areas that all members should be aware of:

Ed collected a total of \$800.00 for his hole-in-one. Congrats Ed, good job, good golfing and hope to see you back in the program for 2022 along with a multitude of other players.

The drawing for the Free Membership Raffle is scheduled for the December 6th Residents Meeting. Tickets are still available at the LHCC Clubhouse.

After a very competitive year the Men's Golf League finished up on October 14th with an awards Luncheon. The complete results can be viewed on the MGA BB and the LHS Website. The First Place Team, Jack Cummings and Bruce Hamilton led the Second Place Team, Ed Gregersen and Don Jacquin, by 3 points. Excellent year, lot of good golf, lot of laughs and a lot of fun had by all. Brian Halm did an outstanding job in setting up, organizing and running the League. I appreciate all the time and effort you put into the League, Brian, and look forward to you doing it all over again next year.

To wrap up the year, we completed the refurbishment of the 9th tee as well as the eroded area around the 2nd and 3rd holes. On October 21st our team of volunteers, Don Jacquin, Bill Begley, Ed Bischoff, Pat Adams, Chuck Florio and Pete Menco manually moved and distributed approximately 10 tons of top soil around the 9th tee. This was followed by the installation of 1,200sqft of sod on the 3rd and 9th holes. With some rain and some luck, all of the sod will adhere and ensure a safer and more enjoyable golf course. HANUKKAH - 11/28/21 to 12/06/21 (celebrates the rededication of the Holy Temple). During the 8 days of lighting of the Menorah ... a variety of after dinner desserts are tradition: fruits, GELT milk chocolate gold coins, jelly donuts, dreidel cookies & a long additional list of others. **Yogurt / Honey Banana Bread** recipe given by Joan (LHS

Ingredients:

1/2 stick butter

3/4 cup of sugar

3 medium ripe bananas, chopped

1/3 cup yogurt

2 cups all-purpose flour

1 1/2 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp baking soda

1 tsp salt

chopped pecans & honey

Directions:

STEP 1 Preheat oven to 350 *. Spray a 9-inch loaf pan with cooking spray.

STEP 2 - With an electric mixer or food processor, cream butter and add sugar blending well. ADD the bananas and process until mashed and blended. Beat in the egg and yogurt.

STEP 3 - Mix the dry ingredients (flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt) together thoroughly.

STEP 4 - ADD the wet mixture to the dry and mix until all the flour is moistened.

STEP 5 - Turn the batter into prepared loaf pan. Bake for 1 hr. Rest in pan for 10 minutes,

STEP 6 - Then turn out of pan on to a cake serving dish. Drizzle with honey & sprinkle chopped pecans.

CHRISTMAS - 12/25/21 (celebrating the birth of Jesus). The celebrations vary from Christmas Eve to January 6th. (The feast of the Epiphany). The table offerings are limitless and dominated by religious beliefs and regional customs. In some cases, combined by both. Ice Cream Cake recipe given by Sandra DeCarlo (a LHS resident, Abbey Road)

Ingredients:

small greased meat loaf pan. (Recommended to use a metal pan not glass).

2 cups of melted ice cream (NOT NON-FAT, NOT

SUGAR FREE)

1 1/2 cups of self-rising flour

Directions:

1. Mix both ingredients together & pour into a small greased loaf pan

2. Bake at 350* for 30-35 minutes.

KWANZAA - 12/26/20 to 01/01/21 (honoring the African past). During celebration feasts, sharing different styles of cooking between communities is very common because the Afro-American population has developed from so many parts of the world.

<u>Corn Spoon Breads</u> recipe given by Lisa Curtis (a Brown University student)

Ingredients:

butter baking spray

3/4 cup yellow cornmeal

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

3 eggs - separated

1 tsp kosher salt

1/4 tsp baking powder

1 (approx.) 14.75 oz. creamed corn

2 whole scallions white & green chopped

1 small chipotle pepper finely chopped

Directions:

STEP 1 Preheat oven to 350 deg. Spray a 12-cup muffin tin with cooking spray.

STEP 2 - Whisk commeal, flour, salt & baking powder in a small bowl.

STEP 3 - In 2nd bowl (large), whisk eggs & creamed corn, then STIR in dry ingredients & scallions & chipotle pepper

STEP 4 - In 3rd bowl (large), whip egg whites until stiff & fold 1/2 into corn mixture. Then fold balance of egg whites until no streaks of white remain.

STEP 5 - Spoon batter into muffin cups and fill close to top. Bake until fluffy & golden.

STEP 6 - Cool 10 minutes in tin, then loosen with spatula around edges & remove & serve.


