

WHAT IS A HERO?

A hero lives among us on Carter Way. On Friday, May 29, Fred Hernandez was doing lawn work around noon when he smelled something burning. "I thought that someone might have been grilling," he stated, "but people don't usually do it in the middle of the day and no people I know grill on this street."

Fred knows this because he knows his neighbors. No sooner had he finished that thought when he looked up and saw the smoke.

Without hesitation he began running down the street towards it and saw thick black smoke was billowing from the kitchen vent on the side of 8 Carter Way. His stomach sank. It was Teresa Snyder's home. Not only does she have trouble walking, she lives alone and...is totally blind.

When he arrived at her home, he began banging on the door and yelling "Teresa, are you okay?" hoping that perhaps she was out with her caregiver when he heard the muffled reply "NO."

After opening the screen door, he tried to open the inner door but it was locked - he shouted "Unlock the door! Unlock the door!"

When she finally managed to open the door, smoke poured out so thick, Fred couldn't even see Teresa.

"Come on, we gotta go, your house is on fire!" he demanded, grabbing her by the arm, pulling her towards safety.

She refused to move, "I don't have any shoes on!"

By this time, a nearby workman doing repairs had jumped off the roof and joined Fred.

Still Teresa refused to leave the house.

"It was like her feet were glued to the floor!" Fred explained. "I said don't worry about your shoes! Your house is on fire - you gotta get out!" Finally, with both men on either side, they managed to get Teresa outside and Fred shouted orders to neighbors who had seen the commotion.

"Call 911! Get her away from here!" Fred barked. Then, he ran home to get a fire extinguisher to put out the blaze or at least keep it from spreading to adjacent homes.

Going back inside (which is against the cardinal rule of dealing with fires). Fred managed to turn off the stove with bits and pieces of the ceiling falling on his head, light fixtures dangling and did his best to put out the inferno. "I thought I had it out but it must have restarted," he pronounced regretfully.

Fast forward, the police, EMTs and fire department arrived and put out the blaze which extensively damaged the home. Teresa, who was boiling eggs for lunch, had paper towels too close to the stove which ignited into flames. She refused treatment and is believed to be living with her caregiver until semi-permanent arrangements are in place. A smoke alarm in her home was found dangling from the ceiling; it is unknown if it was operable at the time of the blaze.

Fred came home when things calmed down, took a shower and was back doing yard work by late afternoon. He bristles at the label, "hero" - "You just gotta know your neighbors and you gotta look out for them."

Spoken like a true hero.

IMPORTANT – **CENSUS Info** – If you haven't filled out the census yet either by mail or on-line, census takers will be knocking on doors of people who haven't filled it out.

COVID-19 testing is free for seniors with Medicare. Stimulus Check – Some are receiving the COVID-19 stimulus check in the form of an EIP card (Economic Impact Payment card). It will arrive by mail in a plain envelope from "Money Network Cardholder Services". The Visa name will appear on the front of the card and the back of the card has the name of the issuing bank, MetaBank, N.A. Activate your EIP card account, set your 4-digit PIN # and get your balance by calling 1-800-240-8100. Sign the back of the card.

Bricktown Specific:

Senior Services is open and offering food delivery, help with rent or mortgage payments, utilities and other services. You can contact them at 732-736-8989.

Bricktown is re-bidding for the VA Hospital.

Brick Townhall is now open at all entrances with health screening, social distancing and masks required.

Brick's beaches are open with swimming allowed as of June 13th. Seniors Badges are free, and seniors can purchase a \$15.00 season parking permit.

Youth summer programs (camp) are set to begin on July 6th.

Summerfest will probably be pushed to dates in August, or may have to be cancelled, depending on the Governor's reopening plan. Trader's Cove concerts in August are still on.

CRISPY CRAB NUGGETS....recipe shared by Captain Denny Shipp... Denny is captain of the Water Valley Fire Dept FD31-04 MS.

- 1 lb. fresh crab meat
- 3 slices of white bread (crust removed)
- 1 egg beaten
- 1 tbsp mayonnaise
- 1 tsp Dijon mustard
- 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tbsp Old Bay seasoning
- 1 tbsp parsley

In a food processor CHOP fine white bread slices. In a large bowl, MIX together egg, mayonnaise, mustard, Worcestershire sauce, parsley & Old Bay seasoning; ADD bread crumbs & crab meat, MIX by hand, do not break-up lumps (just break-up the large ones). SHAPE into balls &

BLUEBERRY LEMON RICOTTA POUND

CAKE....recipe from HARDCORE ITALIAN BLOG by Marisa ...Eating Well...

This is blueberry season...best from EMERY'S FARM 346 LONG SWAMP RD., NEW EGYPT, NJ 08533 609-758-8514.

- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 5 tbsp unsalted butter
- 3 large eggs
- 3/4 cup part skim ricotta cheese
- 2 tbsp lemon zest
- 2 tbsp lemon juice + 1 tsp lemon juice (divided)
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
- 2 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 cups fresh BLUEBERRIES
- 2 tbsp packed confection sugar (10X)

STEP 1. Preheat oven to 350 deg. F. Coat a 9x5 loaf pan. Spray & line bottom with Parchment paper.

STEP 2. Beat sugar + butter in a large bowl with electric mixer. Beat in eggs 1 at a time. Beat in ricotta cheese, lemon zest, 2 tbsp lemon juice & vanilla. Sprinkle flour on top. Then sprinkle evenly baking powder, & salt over flour. On low speed beat until all combined. ADD blueberries by gently folding into batter, then transfer to pan.

STEP 3. Bake for 1 hour. Insert tester in center... run knife around the pan to loosen cake... invert onto rack carefully. Turn right side up & let cool. Whisk together the remaining lemon juice (1 tsp) & 10X sugar to make a glaze...BRUSH on top of cake.

GARDEN CLUB

With no meetings in March, April and May, our 2020 season is off to a slow start as are the other committees. clubs, and programs in our community. But in May with the permission of the Board of Trustees, club members planted flowers in various areas to add color and brightness until we all are safe from this pandemic and can return to our many activities. So, with little to report on our meetings, I give you the following garden hints for July.

CHECKLIST FOR JULY

- Keep removing spent flowers and apply a slow release fertilizer to annuals to encourage new blooms.
- Check roses for black spot and powdery mildew and treat accordingly.
- Fertilize roses in August for the last time of the season.
- The months of July and August are the time to divide iris.
- Remember your pets. Keep compost, garden waste and hazardous materials in a safe place.
- Check containers and hanging baskets for water needs.
- Water in the morning when little water is lost to evaporation.
- Pinch back ends of leggy basket plants.
- Maintain a 3-inch layer of mulch around trees and shrubs away from trunks.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT - Did you know that many flowers are edible?? These are just a few.

Nasturtium, flowers and leaves, start sweet then finish with a peppery flavor like watercress.

Roses are fruity and fragrant, the darker the petals, the more pronounced the flavor.

Marigolds range in flavor. Based on variety, they can be citrusy, smoky or have a honeylike sweetness. Common garden marigolds may be pungent and bitter.

PLANTS TO REPEL SPIDERS AND OTHER PESTS.

During the summer, mosquitoes, flies and spiders are often found where they are not wanted. Instead of using repellents that are not safe around animals, food or for that matter people, try using some harmless plants that insects can't stand.

- Lavender Pleasant smelling, repels moths, fleas, flies and mosquitoes. And it's a pretty plant.
- Peppermint Minty-fresh smell that insects hate. In the garden use in a pot as it is very invasive.
- Lemongrass Used to make citronella candles that helps repel mosquitos has a citrus-like smell.

- Basil This kitchen herb is great in many dishes, but its smells and oils help repel bugs. Grown on your window sill, you will have fresh basil to toss in your dishes.
- Rosemary A favorite for cooking helps repel insects.
- Marigolds Pretty flowers, potted inside or out in the garden contains pyrethrum which is used wildly in insect repellents.

HOMEMADE WEED KILLER RECIPE: Environmentally safe and cheap

I know this has been given before, but it really works, especially between cracks in the pavement or blocks.

Makes about 1 gallon of spray. You can cut the recipe according to your needs.

Heat: 1 quart of white vinegar (any brand)

Add: 2 cups Epsom Salt. Wisk till dissolved.

Set aside till cool

Add: 1/4 cup Dawn dish soap to a spray bottle.

Add: Vinegar/Epson Salt mixture to spray bottle. (pour slowly to avoid suds) Gently mix

You may have to spray twice for larger growing weeds. Not sure when we'll be able to have our meetings again, but we will continue caring for our plants and displays throughout the summer months.

REPORTING ID THEFT

From the Asbury Park Press

Reporting online identity theft is as easy as 1, 2, 3. Here are the steps according to the Federal Trade Commission's program **IdentityTheft.gov**.

- 1. (A) Call the companies where you know the fraud occurred and ask for their fraud department. They can freeze your account to prevent new charges.
- (B) Replace your password, login IDs and personal identification numbers for these accounts.
- 2. Place a fraud alert and get your credit reports. To place a fraud alert, contact one of the three major credit bureaus. That company must report the fraud alert to the other two. Here are the three major credit bureaus and how to contact them:
 - -Experian.com/fraudalert, 1-888-397-3742
 - -TransUnion.com/fraud, 1-800-680-7289
- -Equifax.com/CreditReportAssistance, 1-888-766-0008

Ask for a free copy of your credit report at AnnualCreditReport.com or call 1-877-322-8228, and review it for transactions you don't recognize.

3. Visit IdentityTheft.gov, and report the fraud to the FTC with as many details as you can remember. They will create a plan of action for you.



Beach Scenes

Its summer time and a great time to get some shots at the beach. On crowded beaches you can shoot the people, activities, and colorful umbrellas. On remote beaches you can look for wildlife, patterns in the sand, or great cloud formations against the water. There's always sunrise images early in the morning. Don't forget sunscreen and a hat!

The challenge with beach shots is getting the proper exposure. Your camera is designed to give you an average exposure of the entire scene. This is why most of your images are properly exposed. A very bright scene tricks you camera into thinking there is too much light, so the camera will cut back on exposure. To compensate you should increase the exposure slightly. If your camera has "scene" modes, use the one for snow or beach.

A great way to enhance your images is using a polarizing filter, which cuts glare the same as polarizing sunglasses. Many photographers use this filter to make the sky in their images darker (and the clouds brighter) but this filter works wonderfully to show the detail in the sand and to remove the reflections in the water.
