





GARDEN CLUB

Linda Adamo

The Garden Club is hibernating at this time of year and waiting to get going again as soon as the weather breaks. Our holiday displays are stored until next year and the worst of our weather is still ahead of us leaving us to dream of spring and getting outdoors once again.

Since not much is happening outside, you may want to work on your indoor plants especially those holiday plants you may have received as gifts. If you did not get any this year, you may want to think about these for next year even if you have to gift yourself.

A Norfolk Pine with its soft, fringed needles looks like a perfect little Christmas tree. It requires 6-8 hours of medium-bright light such as an east or west facing window. Water when dry to the touch but don't let it get too dry or you'll be cleaning loads of brown needles! This minitree is a keeper which you can keep thriving by refreshing the planting medium by topdressing with new soil every two years. It may be taken outdoors in late spring and placed in a shaded location. Bring in before outside temps reach 40 degrees. Fertilize every 6-8 weeks with standard fertilizer

Since most people buy or receive poinsettias over the holidays, the following points will help them last. Never overwater! They are a tropical plant and need to dry before watering. It is suggested that you poke holes in the foil they are usually wrapped in and once watered, leave them in the sink to drain completely. If you choose to try to keep them until next year, place in a bright window after the holidays. After April 1, remove the colored leaves, shaping the plant by pinching tips until early August. Feed every two weeks with a standard fertilizer. In September, move to a room where it only gets Mother Nature's light with NO artificial light after sunset. In early October, move back to your regular living area and cross your fingers. If this doesn't work, remember Shop Rite sells them and pick one up when you do your holiday grocery shopping.

March 11th will mark our first meeting of 2020. Mark your calendars and join us in the Lion's Den at 10:30 a.m. You'll be glad you did.



HONORING OUR PRESIDENTS

I cannot think of better time to post some of their favorite recipes. At random, **President Ronald Reagan & President John F. Kennedy**, in addition to their favorites, LOVED ICE CREAM.

Peg McKenna, thank you so much for your ICE CREAM CAKE RECIPE.

- 1). Line the bottom of a 9x12 Pyrex dish with ice cream sandwiches of your choice.
- 2). 1st layer ... cover with hot fudge from a jar (room temperature).
 - 3). 2nd layer ... lightly cover with cool whip.
 - 4). Repeat layers #2 & #3. Freeze to set.

- 1). Cream butter & sugar well, add beaten egg yolks; alternately, add buttermilk & sifted flour & salt.
- 2). When ready to bake ... fold in baking powder & beaten egg whites ... mixture is now ready for a preheated waffle iron. Top with warm maple syrup & melted butter.

CRAB ARTICHOKE CASSEROLE:

3 tbsp butter, 3 tbsp flour, 1 1/2 cup milk, 1 tsp salt, 1/8 tsp pepper, 1/4 tsp Wostershire sauce, 2 cups crab meat, 4 hardboiled eggs quartered, 1 can artichoke hearts, drained, 1/3 cup grated parmesan cheese.

- 1). Melt butter in a saucepan, stir in flour & gradually add milk & seasonings and cook over low heat, stirring constantly until mixture is thickened.
- 2). Remove from heat & stir in crabmeat & artichoke hearts.
- 3). Prepare a 1 1/2-quart casserole dish (with greased bottom), pour crabmeat mixture into dish, place quartered hard-boiled eggs on top & sprinkle with parmesan cheese.
 - 4). Bake at 350 deg. for 30 minutes.

5 THINGS YOU NEVER KNEW YOUR CELL PHONE COULD DO

For all the folks with cell phones. (This should be printed and kept in your car, purse, and wallet. Good information to have with you.) There are a few things that can be done in times of grave emergencies. Your mobile phone can actually be a life saver or an emergency tool for survival. Check out the things that you can do with it:

FIRST: Emergency

The Emergency Number worldwide for mobile is 112. If you find yourself out of the coverage area of your mobile network and there is an emergency, dial 112 and the mobile will search any existing network, establish the emergency number for you, and interestingly, this number 112 can be dialed even if the keypad is locked. Try it out.

SECOND

Have you locked your keys in the car? Does your car have remote keyless entry? This may come in handy someday. Good reason to own a cell phone:

If you lock your keys in the car and the spare keys are at home, call someone at home on their cell phone from your cell phone. Hold your cell phone about a foot from your car door and have the person at your home press the unlock button, holding it near the mobile phone on their end. Your car will unlock. Saves someone from having to drive your keys to you. Distance is no object. You could be hundreds of miles away, and if you can reach someone who has the other 'remote' for your car, you can unlock the doors (or the trunk).

THIRD: Hidden Battery Power

Imagine your **cell battery** is very **low**. To **activate**, press the keys *3370#. Your cell phone will restart with this reserve and the instrument will show a 50% increase in battery. This reserve will get charged when you charge your cell phone next time.

FOURTH: How to disable a STOLEN mobile phone?

To check your mobile phone's serial number, key in the following digits on your phone: #06#. A 15-digit code will appear on the screen. This number is unique to your



handset. Write it down and keep it somewhere safe.

When your phone gets stolen, you can phone your service provider and give them this code. They will then be able to block your handset so even if the thief changes the SIM card, your phone will be totally useless. You probably won't get your phone back, but at least you know that whoever stole it can't use/sell it either. If everybody does this, there would be no point in people stealing mobile phones.

FIFTH: Free Directory Service for Cells

Cell phone companies are charging us \$1.00 to \$1.75 or more for 411 information calls when they don't have to. Most of us do not carry a telephone directory in our vehicle, which makes this situation even more of a problem. When you need to use the 411 - information option, simply dial: (800) FREE411, or (800) 373-3411 without incurring any charge at all. Program this into your cell phone now. This is sponsored by McDonald's. This is the kind of information people don't mind receiving, so pass it on to your family and friends.



Here are a few pictures which we hope will capture the spirit of Havana. We found the people quite friendly and felt totally safe there.









PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a physician's script/note which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the Administrator and will be confidential. Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. We suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.

The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

ALWAYS CALL 911 FOR ANY MEDICAL EMERGENCY.

Please be sure to keep on hand extra supplies of medications and food, so that there is no need to leave the house during or immediately after a snowstorm. The weather predictions generally provide ample warning time for making preparations.
