High average for the men were - Dennis Grasso with a 212. Peter Brennan with 190, and Tino Yodice with a 189.


High average for the ladies were - Deb Tristam with 174, Janet Bazaz with a 138 and Sandra DcCarlo with a 128.

THE GARDEN CLUB

As I'm writing this, we are all housebound because of the Coronavirus. I hope by now the worst is over and we have all come through unscathed. There was no meeting in April, however, by May some of the topics to be finalized include Watering Schedule, Assignments for gardens, new plantings and our Spring luncheon.

Our membership has increased from 15 in 2019 to 18. We are happy to welcome Ingrid Holz, Carol Farley and returning member Pat Ludwig.

If you prepared your garden in the fall, you have only to do some rough cleaning up to begin planting. But before you begin, be aware that the last frost date in Ocean County can be from May 15 to May 30. Planting before the last frost may result in dead or damaged plants.

SOME HINTS FOR SPRING

- Some plants needing pruning after blooming include Forsythia, Weigela, Lilac and Spirea
- Remove seed heads from Rhododendrons and Azaleas
- Watch roses. Spray for aphids, black spot and other pests
- Eliminate weeds before they go to seed. Preen is a good choice
- Most plants will benefit from a spring fertilizing of 10,10,10
- Remember to use plants that attract humming birds, butterflies and beetles
- Free mulch is available at the Ocean County Recycling Center. Bring your own containers

Be aware that May and June are the greatest season for tick bites. Ticks prefer cool moist woodlands, but they can also be found in lawns bordering woods. Ocean County has 3 common types of ticks.

Lyme disease is spread by the black legged tick (deer tick) which is active as long as temperatures are above freezing. Ticks need to be attached for at least 36 hours



before they can transmit Lyme Disease. In New Jersey one out of every four or five ticks is infected. Symptoms include bulls-eye rash, tiredness, fever or chills, headache, stiff neck, muscle aches, joint pain and dizziness. After being bit, check your health closely for a month and call your doctor if you have any early signs of disease.

To avoid ticks, apply insect repellent containing DEET, wear long pants and long sleeves, After being outdoors, check yourself and your clothes carefully. If attached, remove ticks as soon as possible. Use tweezers and grab the tick close to the skin. Pull straight up. Wash the skin with soap and water.

If your daffodils and tulips did not perform well this year. Check the following:

- Maybe you planted too early or to late for spring blooming
- Perhaps you didn't plant deep enough. Should be planted 2-3 times their height in the soil
- If leaves are small, they may need dividing
- If bulbs don't sprout, squirrels or voles may be the reason.
- Unseasonable freeze-thaw cycles also hinder bulb performance. Not much we can do about Mother Nature
- Leave the plants alone till the leaves are wilted to give it a chance to store energy for next year's bloom

Our articles deal mostly with flowers, but container gardening of vegetables can be very satisfying. Seed companies now offer dwarf varieties adapted for limited space. Make your selection carefully being sure to pick ones that are suited to container planting. Select an adequate container which has drainage holes in the bottom. Stones or crushed plastic can be added to the bottom to assist drainage. Use good potting soil and fertilize according to your selection. Some vegetables adapted to container planting include: bush beans, carrots, cucumbers, lettuce, peppers, bush squash, Swiss chard and dwarf tomatoes. Be sure to be careful of under or over watering. Why not give it a try?

2020 POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY. Swim at your own risk.
- THUNDER AND LIGHTNING: When thunder occurs, all individuals must leave the pool area. The pool area will be reopened when conditions permit.
- Pool furniture must be kept at least six (6) feet from the coping of the pool. FOR SAFETY REASONS. Place a covering on the chairs and chaise lounges to protect them.
- Restrooms shall not be used as changing rooms. Dripping bathing suits and bare feet are not allowed in the clubhouse and restroom.
- At all times members/residents and/or guests over 16 must display numbered plastic badges for admission to the pool area.
- 6. Children under 16 must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult and must be signed in. No child age 3-16 will be allowed in the pool between 1pm and 5pm except on Saturdays, when they are allowed in the pool from 10am -7pm. Children under the age of 3 are permitted in the pool area but are not allowed in the pool during children's pool hours.
- Bathers must wear suitable bathing suits or swim wear. Cut-off pants or jeans are not permitted in the pool.
- Flotation objects, such as inflatable tubes, kickboards, and flippers, are not permitted in the pool. Styrofoam belts and arm "swimmies" will be permitted in the pool if an adult is in the pool with the child.
- Diving is not permitted.
 Jumping into the pool is permitted when standing on the edge.
 Lap lanes must be kept open for lap swimmers.

- Bathers shall not sit on the stairs or ladders of the pool, FOR SAFETY REASONS.
- 10. Snacks, plastic bottles and cans are permitted inside the pool area and must be consumed at a table. NO GLASS IS ALLOWED. NO ALCOHOL BEVERAGES ARE ALLOWED. Picnic tables are available outside the pool area for those having sandwiches, subs, pizza, etc. A charcoal grill, has been installed for your use outside the pool area. A fire shovel and ash can are also provided. Please clean up after use! Garbage and recyclables must be disposed of in the receptacles that are provided outside of the pool entrance.
- No sports, including ball playing or horseplay, will be permitted in the pool area. Children may have dive toys in the shallow end of the pool. Running is not permitted in the pool area. Excessively loud music is not permitted.
- 12. Pets are not permitted in the pool area.
- 13. Please use the designated smoking area at the end of the sidewalk in the parking area. Smoking is not permitted near the pool area or in any other sports area.
- 14. Chairs, tables and lounges are available to residents on first come basis. THEY MAY NOT BE RESERVED. Please bring chairs for your guests.
- Our pool maintenance company is Pool Operation Management.










Illustration of the correct Interlocking Grip. This grip is essential and is used by 95% of all golfers, including the pros. We find many beginners have difficulty mastering this grip, but keep at it; after a while it becomes automatic. This grip is used for all golf shots except putting - which is another lesson.

KRIMS PROTOCRAPHY Stay At Home Photography

With the recent virus pandemic, most of us are at home trying to keep ourselves busy and keep our sanity. Now is a good time to do some photography while practicing social distancing. It's spring and mother nature supplies us with a lot of material.

There is an abundance of flowering trees and flowers. Use a small aperture (F11 or higher) if you want most of the image in focus or a smaller aperture (F4 or less) if you want to blur the background to make a flower stand out like a portrait.

You can also try some still life photography around the house. Again use depth of field to control how much of the image is in focus. A tripod is handy for those close up shots. Don't forget the sunrise and sunset images as well.
