

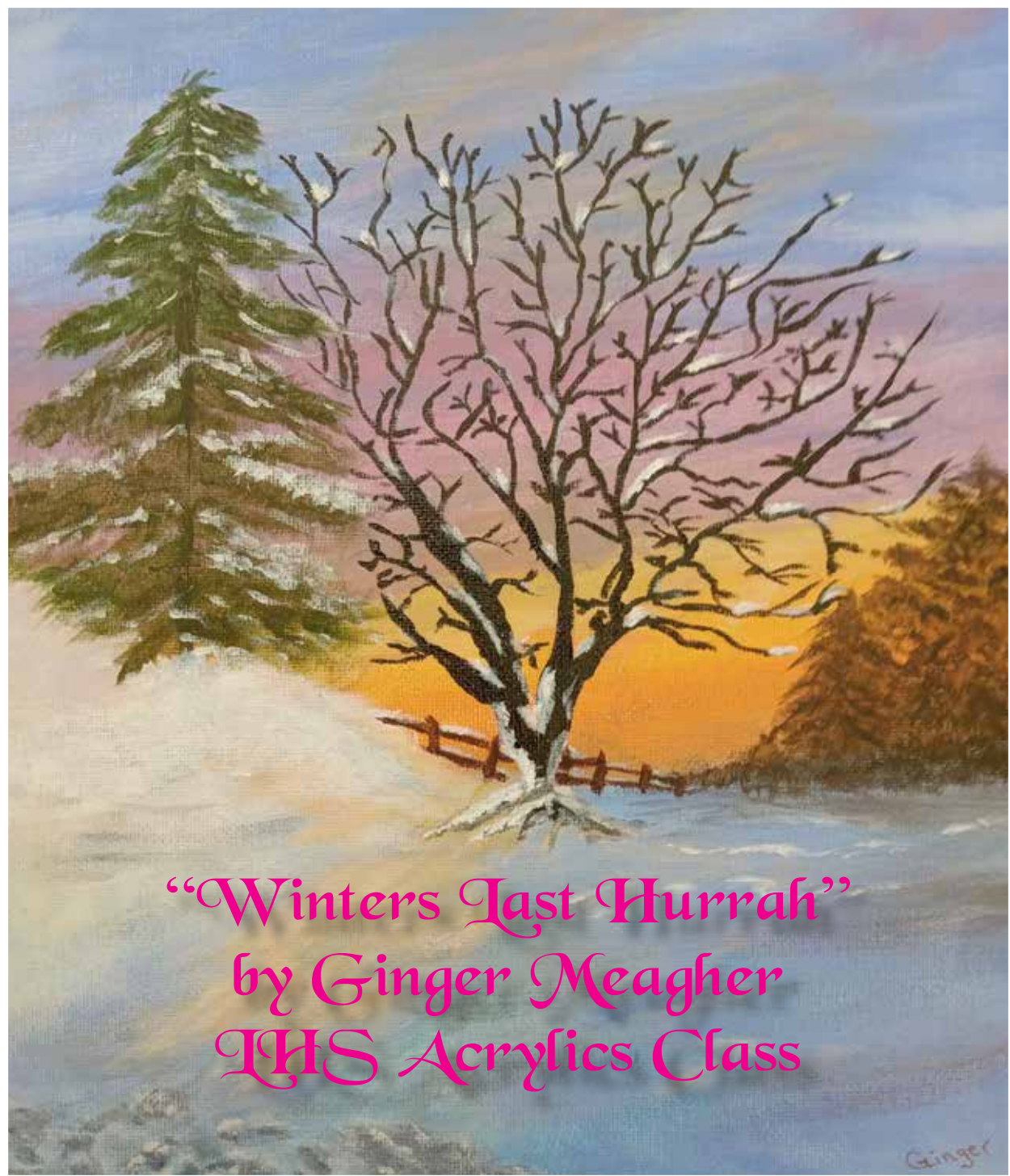

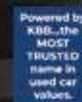

GARDEN CLUB

Time to gear up for the spring/summer growing season. The Garden Club will hold the first meeting of the year on March 13th. This is when our members select their garden assignments, volunteer for summer watering and finalize completion of planned projects; such as, plantings for the back of the clubhouse and, still to be determined, how to enhance the new pool area and the creation of a butterfly garden.

This month is the time to plant indoors the seeds that need 8-10 weeks to sprout. When your sprouts are a couple of inches tall, start hardening them by placing them outside for 2-3 hours in a protected location. Gradually increase the amount of sunlight an hour at a time over a two-week period until they are able to spend all day outside. The last day or two, the plants can spend 24 hours outside. Reduce the amount of water plants receive (keep moist) but do not allow them to wilt.

It may be redundant every year, but a good reminder of what can be done in early spring to prepare your slice of garden heaven: Transplant those houseplants

This is the best time of year for transplanting and splitting those overgrown house plants.

Prune Your Shrubs Late:

Winter is a good time to prune your shrubs before spring growth starts. While branches are still bare, it's easier to see what you're doing. Focus on dead, broken, or crossing stems first, and then shape the overall plant as you wish. Pruning often will encourage your shrubs to produce lots of fresh stems once they begin to grow again in the spring.

Prune the Most Common Landscape Evergreens:

Many common landscape shrubs benefit from late-winter pruning, including most roses, dogwood, spirea, juniper, yew, and viburnum. Avoid pruning shrubs that bloom in early spring, or you won't get any flowers this

year. Wait until right after these plants bloom to make your cuts.

Celebrate the Earliest Blooms:

Some plants such as crocus, hellebore, and camellia bloom in very late winter. If you have any of these early-blooming flowers appearing in your yard, make the most of them.

Clear away any debris such as last year's dead foliage or twigs that may be hiding the flowers from view. Try putting a few colorful blossoms in a vase inside if it's too cold to admire them outside or you can't see them from a window. If you don't have any winter-blooming plants, take a walk around your neighborhood to get ideas for what you could plant for a little early color to tide you over until spring really gets going.

Even after warmer weather arrives in spring, it can take a while for your garden plants to bloom. A few well-placed containers, however, will give you a quick shot of color wherever you need it.

Even if there's still snow on the ground, you can pull out your planters (or stock up on pretty new containers) and fill them with potting soil. That way, you'll be ready to add plants as soon as pansies and other cool-season annuals arrive at your garden center or grocery store.

Architectural Regulations Revisions

Please Tear out and Place in the Lions Head South By-Laws Architectural Regulations, Page 14, XV. Exterior Storage of Trash or Supplies

Revisions to Restrictions on Common Property Uses and Exterior Storage of Trash or Supplies, Second Paragraph.

Motion approved by the Board of Trustees February 12, 2024.

PLEASE NOTE REVISION TO PAGE 14, XV. EXTERIOR STORAGE OF TRASH OR SUPPLIES TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Lions Head South Architectural Regulations Page 14, XV. Exterior Storage Deck Box and Upright Garden/Storage Container. Replaces 2nd Paragraph.

One (1) small deck box, no larger than six (6) feet in length, thirty-six (36) inches in height and thirty-six (36) inches deep, with a top hinged lid only, may be placed behind the air conditioner on either side of the house, but not on the street side if a corner property. It may also be placed on the rear patio at the rear of the house. In addition, one (1) upright storage/garden container, measuring no larger than six (6) feet in height, three (3) feet wide and three (3) feet deep may be stored on the rear patio. A maximum of two (2) units (one of each) maybe placed on each property. The storage units may not be made of wood and must be constructed of man-made materials. It must be stand-alone and may not be attached to the house. The color must blend in with the existing color of the house. Prior approval of the size, color and location of the storage unit (s) is required by the Architectural Committee.

Happy March! Hopefully, the wintry weather is behind us and we can look forward to the upcoming spring season.

Just a revision for reporting street light outages in our community. It has been noted that if a **HOMEOWNER** calls JCP&L to report a light out, the response time is shorter than notifying Diane Steenan or the office, so below is the procedure going forward:

Following these procedures will ensure all reports are documented and follow-ups are consistent:

1. Obtain pole # located on the street side of the light pole, and nearest house address.

2. Call JCP&L 800# (located on your bill) **OR** go online to your JCP&L/First Energy account – Click on **‘OUTAGES’ – ‘OUTDOOR LIGHTING PROBLEM’**. Follow the prompts to submit the street light outage.

3. Call the Lions Head South Office at 732-920-9099 to advise them of your submission. This report will be added to the outage document kept by the office staff.

4. If the light isn't replaced within a reasonable amount of time, call again - the squeaky wheel gets the oil!

Our Neighborhood Watch is always on alert however. Anyone can and should keep the non-emergency number in their phone to report anything they feel is out of the ordinary. Our walkers and pet owners are the best in noticing any suspicious behavior - even if you're unsure - best to call 732-262-1100 and let the police investigate.

Lastly, if you are a pet owner, many veterinarians offer free pet alert decals that you can put on your door or front window if there is a fire in your home to alert firemen to look for animals - it is so important to keep our furry friends safe!

Stay safe and remember - if you see something, say something and call the above number.

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

As we approach the warmer weather, the Architectural Committee would like to remind all residents that any additions and alterations to the exterior of your home requires an application for consideration and APPROVAL, prior to the start of any work. This includes, but not limited to, trees (removal & planting), roofs, windows, siding, patio extensions, landscaping fences. Once approved, the homeowner will be notified and receive a purple work permit to display in their front window. Upon completion, the homeowner will return the permit to the office and a committee member will inspect to ensure work was complete according to application.

NOTE: Permits are only valid until December 31st of the current year. If any residents that have blue permits, and the approved work was **NOT** completed in 2023, a new application **MUST** be submitted, and the expired Blue Permit returned to the office.

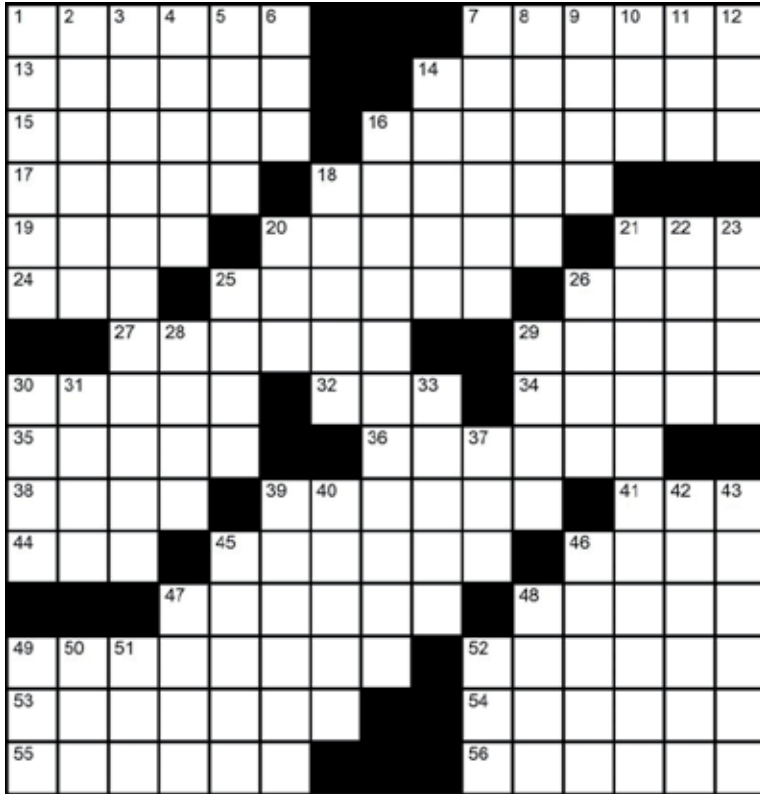

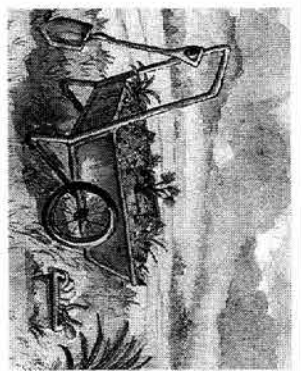

- 1 small ricotta
- Sprinkle of: onion & garlic powder, black pepper

1. In a medium/large bowl > mix mozzarella, ricotta & spices.
2. Add dry spinach & continue to mix until all blended.
3. Place in pie crust
4. Bake at 350° for 40-45 mins.

30 MINUTE SHEPHERD'S PIE

Ingredients:

- 2 lbs. potatoes - peeled & cubed - russet suggested
- 2 tbsp. sour cream or softened cream cheese
- 1 large egg yolk
- 1/2 cup cream, (for a lighter version sub with vegetable or chicken broth)
- Salt & ground black pepper
- 1 tbsp extra-virgin OO, 1 turn of the pan
- 1 3/4 lbs. ground beef or lamb
- 1 carrot chopped
- 2 tbsp. butter
- 2 tbsp. all-purpose flour

- 1 cup beef stock or broth
- 2 tsp. Worcestershire
- 1/2 cup frozen peas
- 1 tsp. sweet paprika
- 2 tbsp. chopped fresh parsley

Directions: PREHEAT BROILER after step 3.

1. Boil potatoes in salted water. Drain & pour in a bowl. Combine sour cream, egg yolk & cream. ADD to potatoes & mash until almost smooth.

2. While potatoes are boiling, preheat large skillet over med. high heat. Add oil to hot pan with beef or lamb. Season with S & P. Brown & crumble for 3-4 mins. If it appears fatty, spoon away some of the drippings. ADD carrots & onion, to meat, cook for 5 mins. stirring frequently.

3. In a small skillet, cook butter & flour together, whisk in Worcestershire sauce. Thicken gravy & add to meat mixture. Fold in peas.

4. Place meat mixture in a casserole & spoon potatoes over the top evenly. Sprinkle paprika & broil 6-8 mins. Top with parsley & serve!

PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2023-2024 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a **physician script/note** which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician.

Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.

The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.
