

As we move into the 2021 golfing season, we are finally getting the change in the weather that we need to get out and play some golf. During April the course will open at 9am, weather permitting, and close at dusk. On Mondays, which is a maintenance day, the course will open at 2PM. From May through October, the course will open at 8am and close at dusk. During this period the course is reserved for the WGA on Wednesday from 8-11:30am and for the Men's League on Thursday from 8-11:30am. If you have any questions concerning operating hours or information on the course, please call 732-477-7277. With COVID in mind, we will continue to play it safe by not signing in to reduce the chance of spreading the virus. This year we are starting our new monitoring system and once fully in force will require sign-in and overall monitoring of players and golf course operations by the Starter/Opener (S/O). The initial period for re-registration has been completed and we are off to a good start with over 90 members registered. Our goal over the next two years is 150 members and we have initiated an advertising program with some of the local over 55 retirement communities.

The Board of Directors meeting that was supposed to take place in February did not happen due to weather conditions. The minutes for the March meeting of the Board of Directors is posted to the outside LHCC BB.

The first Scramble for the 2021 season is scheduled for April 13th and the results will be included in the next issue of the Pride. Scrambles are scheduled for the second Tuesday of each month April through October, except for September. The Scrambles, which are set up for the members of the LHCC, cost \$10.00 with prizes and refreshments. We practice social distancing and face masks are required around the first tee and clubhouse. If you are a member of the LHCC and have not played in a scramble, sign-up for the next one. Sign-up sheets are posted to the outside LHCC BB.

The yearly raffles run by the LHCC, 20/20 and Free Membership raffles will be started shortly and the information sheets with tickets are enclosed in this issue of the Pride. Ticket sales will start on Monday, April 12th, 9:30-11:30, and continue on subsequent Mondays. The first drawing for the 20/20 raffle will be on Thursday, June 3rd and will continue each Thursday through October 11th. Over the course of the 20 drawings, \$2,950.00 will be awarded. Your support is greatly appreciated.


The Buildings and Grounds Committee would like to welcome Spring and put Winter behind us. The committee is excited to continue working on several projects as the warmer months quickly approach.

The Old Farmer's Almanac

The term "All Fools," was probably meant as a deliberate stab at All Saints (November 1) and All Souls (November 2) Day. Although the origin of playing practical jokes and pranks on this day is hazy, many folklorists believe it may go back to 16th-century France. At that time, New Year's Day was March 25, with a full week of partying and exchanging gifts until April 1. In 1582, the Gregorian calendar moved New Year's Day to January 1. Those who forgot or refused to honor the new calendar were teasingly called, "April Fool!" Weather folklore states, "If it thunders on All Fools Day, it brings good crops of corn and hay."

GARDEN CLUB

Due to COVID and the deadline of this article, I cannot report whether our first meeting scheduled for March 10, was held. We'll catch up next month.

Our Garden Club has been in existence since the summer of 1987 and has had great impact on our community. Its members are all volunteers whose goal it is to beautify and enhance our common grounds with flowers for all to enjoy. Plantings are done and maintained at several area gardens, various decorative planters and seasonal decorations at both entrances to the Clubhouse.

You are invited to join our Club. We meet on the second Wednesday of the month March through November. Dates of our monthly meetings can be found in the LHS Calendar.

Perhaps you've noticed work being done at the corner of Yorkwood Drive and Lions Head South Blvd. With the cooperation of the Building and Grounds Committee, three members of the Garden Club, Clare Mathiasen, Debbie Gehringer and Carmela Ferraro presented plans to update and replace the old and dying shrubs and trees. This area is dedicated to long-time member, Grace Robertson, who was a founding member of the Garden Club and remained a member until her death at age 92. Hopefully, this renewed area will be enjoyed by all for many years to come.

If you prepared your gardens in the fall, you are all set to go for this season.

Start by removing any diseased, dead or weak branches damaged by winter storms.

Prune roses before new growth appears.

Divide and transplant crowded perennials such as chrysanthemums, delphiniums and day lilies.

Deadhead tulips and daffodils but leave foliage to die naturally.

Plant new shrubs before the weather becomes too warm.

If you're a regular reader of these articles, you know how much I like this recipe for a homemade weed killer. It's easy to make, cheap and it works. So, if you missed it or misplaced it, I'm repeating it again.

Directions:

Heat up 1 quart of white vinegar (any kind) Add 2 cups Epsom salt (stir till all dissolved) Add ¹/₄ cup dish soap (any kind)

When cool, transfer to a spray bottle and go to work. Great for weeds in cement cracks or between blocks. Larger weeds may need a second application. Try it. I promise this is the last time I'll write it.

A reminder to be aware that the upcoming months of May and June are the greatest season for tick bites. When working outdoors, use precautions like wearing light clothing and check yourself carefully when you come inside.

If you've lived here for a while, you are aware of the problem of deer eating many of our plants and flowers. Be aware that deer will eat almost anything depending on the circumstances. Following are a few suggestions from Rutgers Cooperative Research and Extension for plants that may be resistant.

Ageratum	Snapdragon	Dusty Miller	Anise	Rosemary
Candytuft	Lobelia	Basil	Parsley	Salvia

The purpose of this document is, hopefully, to simplify the understanding of the Bylaws that govern us here at Lions Head South (LHS).

At this writing (2021) the Lions Head South Association is approaching its 40th Anniversary. The current appearance, condition and healthy financial position of our community is a testament to the effectiveness of the proper application of our Bylaws. Every new homeowner receives a copy of the Lions Head South Association Bylaws and Rules & Regulations (Bylaws/R&R). At first glance they might appear a bit overwhelming, but if you take a look at them a little at a time you will come to understand what makes us tick.

Over a period of time certain Bylaws/R&R become outdated or require revision to keep up with current trends and actualities. Through the years the Bylaws Committee has made changes to the Bylaws/R&R as needed and will continue to do so. *Recommendations/suggestions from homeowners are encouraged and welcomed.*

Let's take a "snapshot" look at how the LHSA functions:

We are a self-governed community run by a 7-person Board of Trustees all of whom are volunteer residents which are elected by the homeowners. They serve a two-year term. We employ a non-resident administrative team and custodians. In addition to the Trustees there are many Standing Committees which oversee various functions for the community. A complete list of the Standing Committees can be found on the inside cover of The Pride (which is our monthly community newsletter). The following is a brief outline covering the responsibilities of a *few* of these Committees. Complete details can be found in the Bylaws/R&R:

FINANCE: This committee monitors income and expenses on a monthly basis, researches and recommends investments and, with input from the various Standing Committees prepares a budget on an annual basis.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS: This committee is responsible for the maintenance of all buildings, outdoor recreation areas (except the golf course), wells, sprinkler systems, lawn care and snow removal. They work with and monitor outside contractors.

ARCHITECTURAL: This committee oversees the condition and appearance of the exterior of your homes and landscaping. All modifications require Architectural approval. They conduct inspections periodically to assure our community maintains its desirable condition.

LIONS HEAD COUNTRY CLUB: This committee is responsible for the maintenance, operation and administration of the golf course, soliciting membership and interacting with outside vendors.

All of these and the other Standing Committees have to prepare budget recommendations and requests for capital improvement or replacement as required.

Joining a Standing Committee is a great way to learn how our community functions and contribute to our continued success.

REMEMBER - Our community runs on volunteers!

A FUN recipe forwarded from Angela Fillare, a friend of a LHS friend......best party recipes ever!

APPLE.GOUDA "Pigs in the Blanket"

Ingredients:

1- tube Crescent rolls

1- small apple peeled & cut into 24 thin slices

6 - thin slices of gouda cheese quartered

24 - mini smoked sausages

a sauce of choice for dipping ... suggested honey mustard salad dressing.

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 375 deg. & line a sheet pan with parchment paper.

2. Unroll crescent dough & separate into 8 triangles.

3. Starting with the wide end, place 1 apple slice, 1 folded slice of *gouda* cheese, & 1 sausage ... roll tight to the point of dough.

4. Place on parchment paper point down ... bake 10 - 12 minutes. Serve with condiment of your choice.

PASSOVER ... MARCH 27, 2021 - APRIL 4th This holiday the JEWISH faith celebrates the exodus of freedom from slavery. The dinner is called a Seder ... and must INCLUDE Matzo, a special unleavened flatbread. A TRADITIONAL/RELIGIOUS recipe forwarded from Shelly Feinberg a LHS friend......a must appetizer to start Passover dinner!

POTATO LATKES for Passover

Ingredients:

4 - med. potatoes (Russets-best to use-hands down), peeled & cut into chunks.

1 - med onion, peeled & quartered

2- tbsps. Matzo meal or more as needed

2 - eggs

1/4 cup olive oil or more as needed

salt & pepper

Apple sauce & sour cream for serving.

DIRECTIONS:

1. Place in food processor 1/4 of the potatoes, all onions, Matzo meal, eggs, salt & pepper. Mix until all are finely chopped. Add the balance of the potatoes & pulse once again, until all potatoes & veggies are finely chopped. Mix well, to bring all together.

2. Heat oil in a skillet over med, heat. Scoop 1/4 cup of mixture (per Latke) into hot oil. Fry until brown on each side. Repeat until mixture is finished.

3. Be sure the mixture holds together, if not add Matzo meal by the tbsp. until the mixture holds together. Add oil if necessary, for balance of frying ... sprinkle with S & P.

SIMPLE ... PIZZA RUSTICA "NAPOLETANO STYLE"

Ingredients:

1 lb. smoked ham chopped fine

2 lbs. whole milk FRESH ricotta cheese

1 cup Locatelli grated cheese

4 eggs

1/4 cup coarse restaurant style black pepper

1/2 cup fresh chopped parsley

1 clove garlic chopped extra fine

DOUGH:

3 1/2 cups of ALL purpose flour

1 3/4 sticks of unsalted butter or Crisco

1 tsp salt

1/2 cup Locatelli grated cheese

3 large eggs

<u>IN FOOD PROCESSOR</u> blend all ingredients except eggs. After blending, add in 1 egg at a time & blend. Remove from processor & roll into a dough ball, (you may need some flour for the roll) wrap in plastic & refrigerate for 30 mins.

Then cut into 2 parts ... one 3/4 of dough ball ... roll to 17"; the other 1/4 ... roll to 12"

DIRECTIONS: for filling

1. In a large bowl mix all above together. Place in refrigerator.

2. Line one 9" spring form pan with larger piece of dough - rolled out to 17".

3. Fill the pan with the cheese/egg mixture to the top.

4. Roll smaller piece of dough to $12^{\circ\circ}$. Place over spring form pan, pinch together top & bottom & seal.



- 2. On Wednesday, April 21 at approximately 2 PM you will be able to access the live session using your computer, smart phone, iPad, or other tablet.
 - a. If you are using a **desktop** or **laptop** computer, go to our website at <u>www.lionsheadso.com</u>: Look for the **Governance** label on the left. When you place you mouse/touch pointer over **Governance** you will see a link for **Live Meeting**. Click on it. (Note- this link will not be active until 1 week before the meeting).
 - If you are using a smart phone, iPad or other tablet, go to our website at <u>www.lionsheadso.com</u>: Once at our website, click on the 3 lines in the top right hand corner and a list of options will appear. Click on the "+" next to the Governance label; then click on Live Meeting- this will bring you the live feed of the Virtual Board of Trustees Update. (Note- this link will not be active until 1 week before the meeting).

You will be able to see and hear the Trustees, however, you will not be able to speak directly with them. This is **NOT** a Zoom call.

We look forward to the opportunity not only to provide an update, but also to address as many of your questions as possible. If you are unable to join us at 2 PM on Wednesday, April 21, 2021, the link to the Live Board of Trustees Update will remain on our website for you to view at your convenience.



For a long time, I have wanted to write an article of my experiences with the different types of scams that are out there regarding our computers. It is not just Seniors that get taken advantage of with these, I myself ALMOST fell for one also!

The scammers that call you on the phone are VERY convincing, the so-called VIRUS that pops up on your computer is designed to scare the heck out of you, and usually does!

So, here I am going to give you a heads up to my advice to being aware of these situations.

- NEVER LET SOMEONE TAKE CONTOL OF YOUR COMPUTER REMOTELY THAT YOU DON'T KNOW PERSONALLY. (If you have called your internet provider directly, and they want to go on remotely, that is ok.)
- MICROSOFT OR TECH SUPPORT COMPANIES WILL NEVER CALL YOU TO TELL YOU THAT YOU HAVE VIRUSES! There is no way they know anything about your current computer data. Hang up, and don't answer when they call back. Scammers can spoof official looking phone numbers, so don't trust your Caller ID.
- 3. If a Virus Scare pops up on your computer, DO NOT CALL THE NUMBER it tells you to call. This is the scammer who will want to remote in and deceive you with a fake list of viruses and ask you to pay hundreds of dollars to remove them. EVEN if the scare warns you that your identity might be compromised! THEY ARE THE COMPROMISING RISK! Here are a couple pictures of what they may look like:



- 4. When you search online for tech support, look out for sponsored ads at the top of the results list. Many of these links lead to businesses that scam consumers.
- 5. Scammers may pose as relatives or friends, calling or sending messages to urge you to wire money immediately. They'll say they need cash to help with an emergency like getting out of jail, paying a hospital bill, or needing to leave a foreign country. Their goal is to trick you into sending money before you realize it's a scam. Believe me, this is the one that almost got me! They are VERY convincing! They play on your emotions and swear you to secrecy and insist that you wire money right away. <u>HANG UP AND CALL SOMEONE TO VERIFY THAT EVERYONE IS OKAY!</u>
- 6. **EMAIL SCAMS** are very easy to fall for. A few that have come along recently and were very easy to fall for. The first one was and email from Amazon saying something was wrong with my payment method so I needed to "CLICK HERE" to fix it. NEVER CLICK ON A LINK IN AN EMAIL THAT WANTS YOU TO VERIFY **ANY ACCOUNT INFO.** Even if the email LOOKS legitimately from the company writing you, it can be easily be a scammer trying to get your account information. Another example from Amazon is: An order confirmation for an item you didn't purchase or an attachment to an order confirmation. This again is them wanting to gain access to your account. The last one I will mention is a phony "delivery failure notification" email making the rounds. It looks like it's from the U.S. Postal Service, UPS or FedEx — but it's not. The email says you missed a delivery. But, it says, if you print the attached form and take it to your local post office, you can pick up your package and avoid penalties. The message might also include a link for more details. Here's the truth: the email is bogus and there is no package. And if you download the attachment or click on a link, you're likely to end up with a virus or malware on your device.

If you are a victim of a tech support scam:

- · Contact your bank immediately.
- Contact your computer technician
- Change the passwords you use to access your bank and other sensitive sites.
- File a report with <u>BBB Scam Tracker</u> and with law enforcement authorities, such as the FTC.
- Report possible fraud at <u>ftc.gov/complaint</u> or by calling 1-877-FTC-HELP.

After reading this information, I hope I have saved at least one person from being scammed. The internet is an amazing thing to enjoy as long as you are careful not to be misled by scammers.
